

BRITISH DOCKERS APT TO REJECT COMPROMISE

Majority of Bosses Ready to Pay

LONDON, Feb. 24.—As reports come in from districts outside London, the claims of the dockers against the employers for the cuts of the employers appear smaller.

Latest figures indicate that something like 30 per cent of the employers are ready to pay the 25 per cent increase demanded; most of those who insist on the complete offer of the employers are in the London district. With these exceptions the whole British population seems to be in agreement.

The strikers know this and there is no reason to believe that the delegates will be able to abandon the strike on the compromise basis. Labor officials agree that the strike will continue for another fortnight.
