## HOW "THE COOK," SYMBOL OF DARK WOMANHOOD UNDER THE OLD REGIME, LEARNS TO GOVERN THE SOVIET STATE

KEY GUBERNA, Ukraine (U.S.A.).—Since the establishment of the Soviet Regime in the Ukraine the percentage of women employed in the most important factories is increasing from year to year. They were mostly used in simple forms of work which did not require much skill, so for instance in the capacity of charwomen, in the departments of the factory where the sugar is tested and the liquid is measured and bottled.

It is only during the past few years that women are being trained together with the working men in the various technical professions. This type of young woman worker is now being employed in the various technical professions. # LOS ANGELES LAND VALUES EMPTY FRAUD

### Method of Inflation

**Crude and Kinky.**

LOS ANGELES, July 13—Boosters assert that Southern California orange land now commands \$4,000 an acre as compared with \$400 a generation ago. But they say nothing about the fact that the growers are in a more prosperous state financially than they were formerly. Certainly the \$3,500 appreciation does not go to them. To whom does it go? The answer is simple and yet it will be sensational news to 99 out of every 100 readers.

The leading boosters are J. F. Sartori, most enterprising banker, and George I. Cochran, foremost insurance promoter and leader of million-dollar advertising campaign. That is the key to the answer.

A generation ago the banks lent growers \$200 on the \$500-acre security. Interest at 6 per cent amounted to \$12 per year. With orange selling at \$1.50, pear, \$2.00, and

to pay the interest. Producing 150 boxes to the acre, growers advanced their prices to \$1.25 per box. The
