HOSTILITIES BEGIN ANEW IN BALKANS DESPITE ULTIMATUM ISSUED BY LEAGUE CONFERENCE

LONDON, Oct. 28.—Despite the ultimatum and the threats of the league of nations of an economic blockade, war has again broken out along the Greek-Bulgarian frontier according to ad-

ditional reports. The Greek troops from Bulgaria were under way, in accordance with the league of nations council ultimatum, a new clash occurred and indications are that fighting

is imminent. The Greek forces, which are now in session at the League of Nations conference at Geneva, have been drawn from the coffers of the League of Nations and the Balkans.

C. N. J., Oct. 22.—A week ago the textile barons decided to make wage cutting offensive.

The attack started in the New England states, and since then the waves of reductions have spread to east and west. The tolling waves of the mills have been so great that now there have to choose, either against wage reductions, or

lower and allow more present

or to go out of business.

The Passaic Situation.

At Worsted Mills and Gas

Woolen Mills in the

Passaic Consolidated Mills,

about a 10 percent wage reduction was imposed.

At the same time overtime hours were reduced to 10 percent.

With this came the wage

In the mills of this corporation the new wage was to be 10 percent less than the old. The new wage is only 10 cents a week less.

Before the wage reduction the new

hours were 500 a week.

The Pilkington Worsted Company on Oct. 15 imposed a 10 percent wage reduction.

reduced the 1,800 workers 10 percent.
