DILUTED SOCIALISM FINDING FAVOR IN WASHINGTON

CONSPIRACY UNEARTHED IN NATION'S CAPITAL

WASHINGTON, June 16.—While Bolshevikism smelting committees have been holding lurid sessions of inquiry and daily newspapers have been flaring the "news" of some newly disclosed Bolshevik conspiracy in the nation's capital, the nation's capital of unprecedent character has been taking form. FORCE THREATENED IN WINNIPEG

UNION STAND FIRM.

WINNIPEG, June 12.—Sudden tempests developed in the strike situation here when it was learned that both sides were ready to meet, that the "inevitable break" was imminent.

Municipal officials said the "Marxist Law" would be declared. It was impossible for the railroads to run trains.
